Whereas by Orders of this Board bearing date respectively the 20th Day of August and the 9th Day of December, 1839, It was ordered and directed, that the Appolment of the Tithe Composition for the Parish of Innishannon, in the Diocese and County of Cork, be amended pursuant to the provisions of the Act of the 1st and 2 Years of the reign of her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abolish Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to substitute Rent Charges in lieu thereof," and William Whiting, of Kilpatrick, near Bandon, and Joseph Nash, a Valuator to the Poor Law Union of Kinsale, were by said Orders appointed to carry into effect the said amendment:

And whereas the said William Whiting and Joseph Nash made a Return, bearing date the 10th of August 1840, purporting to be an Appolment of said Composition, agreeably to our said Orders, whereupon by one further Order, bearing date 1st October, 1840, it was ordered and directed, in further pursuance of the provisions of said Act, that the Original
