A True Note and Tenures of the Glebe Lands,  
Glebe House and Vicarial tythes of the  
Episcopally united Parishes of Imiscalthra,  
Lomush and Moyroe in the Diocese of Killaloe  
Co. and Counties of Clare and Galway

First, There are twelve acres of Glebe situated  
in the Parish of Lomush (of which there is a  
map in the Registry Office of Killaloe) for  
which the Vicar pays two pounds 10s per acre,  
the rent being fixed down to that sum by a  
Grant of Four Hundred and fifty pounds 10s  
from the Board of First Fruits, a Lease being  
made by John Purk of Tintun in the County of  
Galway Esq. (The Proprietor of the Estate on which  
the Glebe is situated) The Lease commences from  
the first day of November in the year one thousand  
Eight Hundred and Thirteen

There were authentically two Glebes in this Union,  
one in the Parish of Lomush, (containing about  
six acres) adjoining the site of the ruined Church  
of that Parish, also another in the Parish of  
Moyroe (containing about fifteen acres) situ-  
ated in like manner around the site of the  
ruined Parish Church. The boundaries of both  
these Glebes, many old people pretend to point  
out to this day, and indeed, those of the Glebe of  
Moyroe, can be evidently and clearly traced, never  
having been completely defaced, yet as no trace  
can be found of either of those Glebes, in the  
Down Survey, or Genl Valancey's maps, Comaught  
never having been surveyed, and that part of  
the map of the Down Survey, which contained  
the County of Clare being lost, the Parish of  
Moyroe is alone excepted. My Recumbent des-
