establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such  
Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition  
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or payable within the Parish of  
Innistee alias Innishan in the County of Galway. do hereby Certify  
that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes  
whatevver within the said Parish is four pounds seven shillings and  
five pence sterling by the year of which sum of four pounds seven  
shillings and five pence of wood one fourth is due and payable  
to the Rector of the Union of Ballinakillick and three fourths are  
due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Digby as Lay Impropriator -

And I do further Certify That the average price of  
Oats being the Corn principally grown in the County for the period  
of seven years ending on the first day of November 1831 (one is Twelve  
Shillings and eleven pence halfpenny per Barrel -
