

Michael Wyche Commissioner duly appointed and sworn
by Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King
George the IV. "intituled an Act to provide for the Composition of Tithes
in Ireland." and also an Act passed in the 2^d & 3^d years of the Reign
of William IV. "intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively
in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the
Reign of his late Majesty King George the IV. providing for
the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make
Such Compositions permanent." and fix a true and just amount
of Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or payable
within the Parish of Innismagrath in the County of Leitrim.
Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one Hundred
and Ninetytwo Pounds by the year, being the Sum agreed on
by the Lord Bishop of Kilmore the Reverend Charles Lyons
Montgomery Incumbent, and a Special Vestry held in the Parish
Church of Innismagrath, of which Sum of One hundred and
Ninetytwo Pounds. Two third parts are due and payable to the
Lord Bishop of Kilmore as a Composition for the Tithe
Claimable by him as owner of the Rectorial Tithes of the said Parish
and the remaining portion or One Third part, is due and payable
to the Reverend Charles Lyons Montgomery Vicar as owner of the
Vicarial Tithes of said Parish.

And I do further Certify, that the average price of
Oats being the Corn principally grown in this County
for the Period of Seven years ending on the First day of November
One Thousand eight hundred and thirty, is Twelve Shillings
and Eleven pence halppenny. Sterling per Barrel.
