The Irish Land Commission.

I Samuel Jones Commissioner duly Appointed and Sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the Reign of King William the Fourth entitled "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent." to Ascertain and fix a True and just Composition for All Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Arammore in the County of Galway, do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Twenty six pounds, fourteen shillings, and nine pence ~~standing~~ by the year, of which sum of twenty six pounds fourteen shillings and nine pence, one fourth is due and payable to the Rector of the Union of Ballinakill and three fourths are due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Digby as Lay Impropriator.

And I do further Certify, that the Average Price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in the County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1831 (one) is Twelve shillings and eleven pence halfpenny per Barrel
