an Act to provide for the establishment of composition for Tithes  
in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and give a true and  
just composition for all lay impropriate Tithes arising grow-  
ing yielded or payable within the parish of Inistioge in the  
Diocese of Ossory and County of Wickliffe. Do hereby certify that  
the true and just amount of composition for the lay impropriate  
Tithes of said <sup>parish</sup> is two hundred pounds Sterling of British Currency  
by the year, and is due and payable to Cesar Sutton Esq. as a  
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as lay improp-  
riator of said parish. — Said agreement to commence from  
the first day of may next for a Term of Twenty one years  
subject to termination every seven years. The first payment to  
be made on the first day of November Next. and he do  
further certify that the average price of Wheat being the Com-  
mon principally grown in such County for the period of Seven  
years ending the first day of November 1821 in One pound Eight  
teen shillings and eight pence half penny per Barrel (the Irish  
currency). —
