

Impropriator of the said Parish of Innistogue, and having made proclamation to that effect ^{neither} they or any person appearing on the part of them ^{or either of them} and there was no opposition made by the said Incumbent, or any Impropriator or either of them to the proceedings in this behalf. And whereas the said Charles W. Hamilton having this day that is to say on the twenty fourth day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty six at a Quarter Sessions held at Grace's Old Castle in the Diocese of Ossory and County of Kilkenny in which the Parish of Innistogue is situated delivered to us the said Justices his Report in writing under his hand whereby he gave us to understand that the average price of good marketable wheat for the seven years preceding the said Application as taken by the said Charles William Hamilton from the Dublin Gazette was one pound eight shillings and five pence and the one third per Barrel. And whereas it having appeared to us by the Certificate bearing date the x fourth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine as well as by the Original agreement and appointment of Stephen Wright and John Maher Esquires Commissioners so appointed under the Acts of his late Majesty entitled the Fourth of George the Fourth Chapter Sixty nine and fifth of George the Fourth Chapter Sixty three produced to us by the Register of the Diocese of Ossory in the County of Kilkenny in which said Parish is situate and given in Evidence before us by and on behalf of the said Applicants that the average price of wheat per Barrel for the seven years preceding the first of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty one was one pound eighteen shillings and eight pence half penny late Irish Currency and that in consequence thereof they the said Commissioners had fixed the amount of the Composition for Tithes in said Parish of Innistogue at Two hundred and thirty pounds annually that is Two hundred pounds as the Rectorial Tithes and Two hundred and thirty pounds as the Vicarial Tithes due and payable to the Incumbent and Lay Impropriator of the said Parish respectively.

Now it appearing to us the said Justices assembled at the Quarter Sessions for the Peace for the County of Kilkenny held at Grace's Old Castle in the County of Kilkenny on the twenty fourth day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty six that the said William J. Coghlin Joseph Robbins John Dalton and Robin Cantwell & & have supported by Evidence their Application and we having enquired into the same and it appearing to us that the Commissioners appointed under the Fourth and Fifth of George the Fourth to value the Tithes in the said Parish of Innistogue in the Diocese of Ossory and County of Kilkenny had fixed the Tithes Composition for the said Parish at Two hundred and thirty pounds yearly to be commenced from the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine and that wheat was the measure of Composition for Tithes of said Parish of Innistogue as appeared to us by the Certificate of the said Stephen

Wright and John Maher Esquires the Commissioners aforesaid and that wheat was one pound eight shillings and eight pence half penny per Barrel late Irish Currency being equivalent to a sum of one pound fifteen shillings and eight pence three farthings British Currency for the seven years preceding the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty one. And it appearing to us that the average price of good marketable wheat for the last seven years was one pound eight shillings and five pence ^{the one third per Barrel} pursuant to the Report of the said Charles W. Hamilton. We do therefore order Adjudge and Decree that the said Tithes Composition be diminished by a sum of eighty seven pounds six shillings and two pence annually and that the same shall now be three hundred and forty two pounds thirteen shillings and five pence annually instead of Two hundred and thirty pounds starting in the Proportions following that is one hundred and fifty nine pounds seven shillings and five pence as and for the Rectorial Tithes instead of Two hundred pounds annually and one hundred and eighty two pounds six shillings as and for the Vicarial Tithes instead of Two hundred and thirty pounds annually and that the same shall commence and be payable in the proportions above mentioned from the first day of November next ensuing the date of this our Orders or Adjudication.
