We the Undersigned John Delaney of Cork and John Connolly of Fergus in the County of Galway Esqrs Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the 4th year of the Reign of Geo: IV. and amended acts entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time / to ascertain and fix a true and just amount of composition for all tithes arising growing yielded and payable within the Parish of Suckilly in the Diocese of Kilmacduagh & County of Galway Do hereby certify that a true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is Forty Pounds Sterling, by the year, of which sum of Forty Pounds Thirty four Pounds Sterling is due & payable to the Undersigned Edward Hartigan as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish and his successors and six Pounds are due & payable to the Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Kilmacduagh and his successors — And we do further certify that the average price of oats being the corn principally grown this part of the County ending November 1830 is Seven Shillings by the barrel — And we do further certify and agree that this composition shall be and continue without alteration for 21 years from the 1st of November next —
