Division of Rathkeale in the said County of Limerick
on the 3rd October 1829.


Whereas by certificate in writing dated
30th day of October 1826 Bolton Waller and Thomas
E. Davenport Commissioners duly appointed under
the act 4th Geo. IV. C 99 to ascertain and fix a true
and just composition for all tithes arising within the
Parish of Iveragh in the County of Limerick did thereby
certify that the true and just amount of composition
for all Tithes within the said Parish was £240.
British by the year of which sum of £240 two
thirds were payable to Edmond Hunt Esquire of
Askeaton as Lay Impropriator or his Representatives
and the remaining 1/3rd was payable to the Vicar of
said Parish and the said Commissioners thereby further
certified that the average price of wheat being the
Corn principally grown in such County for the
period of 7 years ending the 1st of November
1826 was £1: 18: 8½ per barrel.

And whereas notice in writing was
duly affixed at the times and in the manner directed
by the Statutes in such case made and provided
Signed by Richard Westropp Reverend John Thomas
