The Parish of Donnell and The Ancient Commissions
were duly appointed and sworn unto and by Virtue
of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of George
the fourth entitled "an Act to provide for the establishment
of composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited time"
and also an Act made in the fifth year of the Reign of the
said King entitled an Act to amend the same to ascertain
and fix a true and just composition for all tithes
arising growing or payable within the parish of
Kilballyowen in the County of Down, do hereby certify
that at a special Vestry duly assembled at Ross in
said parish of Kilballyowen on the 20th day of April
instant for the purpose of carrying into execution
the purposes of the said Acts that the said parish
vestry incumbent of the said parish of Kilballyowen
did then and there enter into an agreement with the
Chairman and Members of the said Vestry so
assembled for the sum of Seventy five pounds ^{to}
to be levied on part of said parish and the further sum
of fifty pounds ^{to} out of the town Land of Killesteehan
and Killesteehan making in the entire out of said parish
to the said incumbent the sum of One hundred and
twenty five pounds ^{to} ^{to be levied} ^{in the year} of the town Land of
