

The John Delaney and John Burke, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to provide for the establishment of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Kilbeacony in the County of Galway, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One hundred and ninety pounds Sterling by the year. and that such composition shall continue to be levied for the term of twenty one years from the first day of May One thousand eight hundred and twenty six. Which sum of One hundred and ninety pounds Sterling is due and payable to the very Reverend Richard Hood, L. L. D. Dean of Kilmaeduff, as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish. and we do further certify, that the average price of wheat, being the corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and twenty one is one pound eighteen shillings and eight pence halfpenny per barrel as taken from the Dublin Gazette Dated this twenty second day of December One thousand eight hundred and twenty five —
