

I. JOHN HENDERSON, Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, (under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of King William the Fourth) entitled an Act to amend Three Acts, passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of his late Majesty, King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland; and to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of *Killbegad Diocesis of Killaloe* in the County of *Mayo* do certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is *one Hundred and Eighty Pounds Six Shillings & Five Pence* sterling by the Year, of which sum of *£180, 6.5. Ninety Pounds Three Shillings & 2 1/2* is due and payable to *the Rev^d Joseph Verschoyle Vicar of said Parish* as a Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as owner of the *vicarial tithes* *Ninety Pounds Three Shillings & 2 1/2* is due and payable to the *Vicars choral of Christ Church St. Patrick's Dublin Rectors* of the said Parish. as a composition for the *tithes claimed by them as owner of the Rectorial tithes*

And I do further certify, that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years, ending on the *first* day of *November 1830* *12/11 1/2* ~~shillings~~ per Barrel.
