for the establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited  
time, as also by virtue of an Act made in the 5<sup>th</sup> year of the reign of  
King George the 4<sup>th</sup> Intituled an Act to amend an Act of the last session  
of Parliament for providing for the establishing of composition for tithes  
in Ireland, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all  
tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of  
Kilberry in the County of Wicklow and Diocese of Dublin

I do hereby certify that the true and just amount of  
composition for tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Three Hundred  
and Sixty Pounds Ster<sup>l</sup> by the year of which sum of three Hundred & Sixty  
Pounds Two thirds or Two Hundred & Forty Pounds Ster<sup>l</sup> are payable  
to Mr. Donoghue Esq<sup>r</sup> as a composition for the tithes claimable by  
him as Lay Impropriator — and the Hundred and Twenty Pounds Ster<sup>l</sup>  
is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Bro<sup>r</sup> Thos<sup>s</sup> being Archdeacon of Wicklow  
as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish  
to be continued invariable for Twenty one — years, and we do  
further certify that the average price of wheat being the best prime  
quality grown in said County for the Period of Seven years ending  
on the first day of November 1821 is Thirty Shillings & 6 Pence
