

Whereas Charles Dwyne Esq^r has sent me with a notice
in writing, in the following words - " Sir, you are hereby required to take
notice that in pursuance of an Act passed in the 2^d & 3^d years of his present
Majesty, entitled an Act "to amend three Acts passed respectively the 4th, 5th and
in the 7th & 8th years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the 4th
providing for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland and to
make such compositions permanent," I Charles Dwyne of Newtown Park
in the Co. of Dublin, in the first and as Agent to Robert Dwyne, of Hills,
Esq^r in the Co. of Wexford, who is seized in fee simple of all that certain
townlands of Ballyweather, and Karristown in
the parish of Kilbride Glynn, Barony of Shelmalier and Co. of Wexford,
or otherwise entitled, according to the provisions of said Act to agree
for and undertake the payment of the composition for tithes,
lawfully payable for and in respect of such lands, do hereby signify
to you his desire to agree for and undertake the payment of such
composition, as aforesaid, for and in respect of said lands, and I hereby
require you to grant a certificate in writing, conformable to the provisions
of said Act declaring him entitled to the benefit of this notice & to
perform the other matters in your power required by the said Act to be
done - Dated this 28th day of October 1824. For Robert Dwyne Esq^r
