

I Oliver Radford the Commissioner  
duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of  
an act made in the second and third of King William  
the fourth intituled / An act to amend three acts, passed  
respectively in the fourth, fifth and in the seventh and  
Eighth, years of the reign of His late Majesty King  
George the fourth, providing for the establishing of  
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such  
Compositions permanent. Do as certain and fix  
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising,  
growing, or to be payable within the Parishes of  
Kilcash in the County of Tipperary and Diocese of  
Lismore.

Do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatevver within the said  
Parishes of Kilcash are One hundred and thirtee  
pounds seventeen shillings and three pence halffenny  
of Annua that is to say the sum of Forty six pounds  
three shillings and one penny of Annua are due and  
payable to Lord Omond as owner of the Rectoria of the  
said Parishes and the further sum of Sixty seven pounds  
fourteen shillings and two pence halffenny of Annua are  
due and payable to the Rev. Chaworth Brown as Vicar  
of the same.

And I do further Certify that the average price of Wheat  
being the Com principally grown in said Parishes for the period  
of seven years preceeding the first day of November 1830 thuly.  
was one pound nine shillings and nine pence of standard  
of the Commission of Radford
