

We Thomas Mahon & Thomas Whitestone Esqrs,
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by
Virtue of an Act made in the fourth Year of the
reign of King George the fourth intituled "an
Act to provide for the Establishment of Composition for
"tithes in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain
and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the parish
of Kilchrist in the County of Clare, do hereby Certify,
that the true and just amount of Composition for
all tithes whatever within the said Parish, is Two
Hundred and seventy-three pounds, fifteen Shillings
Sterling by the year, of which sum of Two Hundred
and seventy three pounds, fifteen Shillings, ninety Pounds
Sterling are due and payable to the Right Hon: the
Earl of Egremont, or to his Lessee, Jonas Studdersh Esq. as
a Composition for Tithe claimable by him as lay impro-
priator of certain lands in the said Parish. — Seventy
Pounds Sterling are due and Payable to Bindon Scott Esq.,
as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as a lay
impropriator of certain other lands in the said Parish,
and One Hundred and thirteen Pounds, fifteen Shillings
Sterling are due and payable to the Reverend William
Hadlock the Vicar of the said Parish, as a Composition
for the Tithe claimable by him. —

And we do further Certify that the average
price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such
County for the period of seven Years ending on the 1st
day of November 1821, is Fifteen Shillings and Two
pence farthing per Barrell. —
