fourth year of King George, the fourth entituled an act
to provide for establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain & fix a true & just
composition for all the tithes arising, growing, yielded or paya-
ble, within the parish of Kilclooney in the County of Galway
do hereby Certify that the sum & parts amount of Compositions
for all tithes whatever within the said parish is one
hundred & thirty six pounds seven shillings & six pence
sterling by the year of which sum of one hundred & thirty
six pounds seven shillings & six pence sterling eight
pounds are due & payable to the Rev. Dean WarBurke as
Dean of Clonfert as a composition for the tithes claimable
by him - Ninety six pounds five shillings & seven pence
halfpenny being three fourths of the residue are due and
payable to the Rev. Patrick Powder as Vicar of S^d Parish
& the sum of thirty two pounds one shilling & ten pence
halfpenny being one fourth of sd residue are due &
payable to the Right Rev^t Christopher the Bishop of
the diocese of Clonfert - & we do further Certify that
the average price of oats (being the corn principally
grown in that County for the period of seven years
ending on the first day of Dec^r 1821 is fifteen
shillings & 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ p^t barrel
