

Tithe composition.

J. Joseph Henry Mybrants having been duly appointed and sworn as Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth entitled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time and by virtue of an Act passed in the second year and third year of the reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth and fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of ^{the reign of} his late Majesty King George the Fourth provided for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilscocks in the County of Kildare do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one hundred and sixty eight pounds by the year of which sum of £ 168. 0. 0 are due and payable as follows. To the Revd Charles Caulfield the Rectorial Tithes arising out of the Townlands of Boycetown and Kilscock producing Twenty eight Pounds to the Assigns of Lord Westmeath with the sum of Fourteen Pounds for the customs called the Marygallons and a further sum of Forty two pounds is due and payable to the above named Revd Charles Caulfield for his Vicarial Tithes arising out of the Townlands called Branganstown Courttown Grathgather Portytorian Blonsact and Laragh to Lord Tremblestown as the Lay Importator the sum of Fifty six pounds by the year and to the assigns of Lord Westmeath the sum of Twenty eight pounds by the year for the small Tithes and Marygallons which the last sums of forty two fifty six and twenty eight making in the whole the sum of £ 126. is due and payable out of the six last named Townlands viz Branganstown Courttown Portytorian Grathgather Blonsact and Laragh with their sub denominations.
