John Allman of Eyre Court and John Mahon of Rosine in the County of Galway Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kileolgan in the County of Galway. Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is One Hundred and Eighty nine pounds Sterling by the year, of which sum of One Hundred and Eighty nine pounds, Fifty two pounds ten Shillings Sterling are due and payable to John Burke as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish and his successors - Ten two pounds Sterling are due and payable to The Bishop of the Diocese of Clonfert and Kilmacduagh and his successors - Twenty six pounds five Shillings Sterling are due and payable to Edward Hartigan as prebendary and his successors -

We do further Certify

that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years, ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1821 one and ten shillings and six pence by the Barrel -
