reign of King George the fourth, intituled an act to
provide for the establishment of composition for tithes in
Ireland for a limited time, that is to say for the term
of twenty one years, to ascertain and fix a true and just
composition for all tithes among growing, Yielding, or
payable within the Parish of Kilcoony in the County
of Cork, do hereby certify, that the true and just
amount of composition for all tithes whatever within said
Parish is one hundred and Sixty pounds Sterling by the year
which sum of one hundred and sixty pounds are due
and payable to the Revd Philip Townsend, as compensation
for the tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of
said Parish Ballyborough 29th April 1825
