Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
parish is One Hundred & Sixty two pounds Eleven shillings
and six pence by the year of which sum of £162..11..6, One
Hundred & Eleven pounds eighteen shillings & three pence are due & payable
to the Rev^d Thomas Gore as a Composition for all Tithes claimable
by him as Vicar of the said parish and Fifty pounds Thirteen
shillings & three pence are due & payable to William Bell Esq^r
as owner of the one Half moiety of the Rectorial Tithes of said
parish,

And I do further certify that the average price of
Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the
period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 is
Twelve shillings & Eleven pence half penny per Btl
