years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the 4th providing for the
establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, & to make such Compositions permanent
to ascertain & fix a true & just amount of Compositions for all Tithes arising, growing,
yielded or payable within the parish of Kileoan otherwise Kileowan in the
County of Westford, do hereby certify

That the true & just amount of Compositions for all Tithes whatsoever within
the said parish is one Hundred and Sixty Two pounds Eleven shillings & six pence
by the year of which sum of £162-11-6 one Hundred & Eleven pounds Eighteen
shillings & three pence are due & payable to the Rev. Thomas Gore as a Composition for
all Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the said parish, and Fifty pounds
Thirteen shillings & three pence are due & payable to William Bell Esq^r
as owner of one half moiety of the Rectorial Tithes of said parish

And I do further certify that the average price of oats being the Corn
principally raised in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day
of November 1830 that, is Twelve shillings & Eleven pence halypenny per Bushel
