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SIR,

I am directed by the Irish Land Commissioners to acknowledge receipt of Notice dated *20 ult* purporting to be signed by three owners of land in the Parish of *Kilcrumper* County of *Cork* each charged with the annual payment of £3 and upwards in respect of Tithe Rent-charge signifying their intention to apply to the Justices at the next ensuing Quarter Sessions for the Peace to be held at *Middleton* in the County of *Cork East Riding* on *24 October 1890* to vary the Rent charge according to the Septennial average price of Corn.

The Commissioners presume that this intended application has reference only to the lay or impropriate Tithe Rent-charge of the Parish as power to vary any Rent-charge vested in them was repealed by the 35 and 36 Vic., cap. 90., sec. 6, sub-sec. 3. *A reply is requested.*
