The grounds upon which we make the above first stated addition are that for the years 1819. 1820. 1821 it appears to us an adequate value was not charged by The Reverend Thomas Browning the Rector for the tithes justly due to him in those years owing to the Proctors employed by him to settle for the same having suffered arrears to accumulate which if enforced would have considerably distressed the Parishioners. The just value was not then either paid, agreed for, nor adjudged to be paid, and we therefore make the above addition as empowered by the 16<sup>th</sup> section of the Act

The grounds upon which we make the above second addition are that for the years 1816 and 1817 statements were produced to us of the amount of tithes received on the Perpetual Curate's part of the Parish which we conceive to be inadequate value upon the articles tithable Procurator } (cont?)
