We the Rev. Mr. Merton Gressan, and Timothy Buckley Commissioners duly appointed and sworn by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth Entituled An Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, also of an Act made in the Fifth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth Entituled An Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielded or payable, within the parish of Kilcumreagh in the County of West Meath and Kings County, (being part of the tennur of Admarcher) Do hereby Certify that an Agreement bearing date the fourteenth day of January 1826 had been entered into on the part of the Marquess of Downshire and the Marchioness of Downshire by their Agent Thomas Murray Esq; to accept of the sum of one hundred and forty seven pounds thirteen shillings and ten pence one farthing by the year for twenty one years as a Composition for the Rectorial Tithes claimable by them from the said Parish of Kilcumreagh as Lay Impropriators We therefore hereby further Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes claimable by them as Lay Impropriators within the said Parish of Kilcumreagh is one hundred and forty seven pounds thirteen shillings and ten pence one farthing by the year Of which sum the whole one hundred and forty seven pounds thirteen shillings and ten pence one farthing is due and payable to them as Lay Impropriators.

The above Certificate having been read and submitted to the consideration of the Voters assembled at a Special Vestry held in Ballagh on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1827 it was agreed to assent to the Composition of one hundred and forty seven pounds thirteen shillings and ten pence one farthing therein stated and that such Composition shall be invariable and shall continue to be levied for the term of twenty one years and shall not be subject to any variation in the amount thereof during such Period of twenty one years whatever the price of corn may be
