J. Lockhart Ramage a Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under & by virtue of an act made in the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> William the 4<sup>th</sup> G 119 intitled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> and in the 7<sup>th</sup> 28<sup>th</sup> years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the 4<sup>th</sup> providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland & to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition for all Tithes arising growing & due or payable within the parish of Kildalkey County of Meath, do hereby Certify that the true & just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Three Hundred & Eighty pounds by the year of which sum of Three Hundred & Eighty pounds the whole is due & payable to Joseph Ashe Esq<sup>r</sup> as Lay Impropriator of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish.

And I do further Certify that the average price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in such Counties for the period of seven years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830 is One pound twelve Shillings & tenpence halfpenny p<sup>r</sup> barrel, signed and dated this 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 1833
