Cox County East Riding) In the Matter of the Parish of
Division of Middleton } Kildorrery in the Diocese of Cloyne
and County of Cork.

Whereas by a Certificate of Tithe Composition bearing date the 19th day of November 1833 the entire annual amount of the tithe composition in said Parish was ascertained to the amount of £319. 2. 0. one half to wit the sum of £159. 11. 0 to be payable to the Vicar of said Parish pursuant to the Statutes in that behalf and the remaining half to John Tawn Esquire as say Impropriator. And it was thereby certified that the average price of oak being the principal grain grown in said County for seven years ending the First November 1833 was twelve shillings and eleven pence halfpenny per barrel.

And whereas by an Order of the Justices assigned to keep the Peace in and for the County of Cork assembled at a General Quarter Sessions of the Peace Holden at Fermoy in and for the Division of Middleton in the County of Cork East Riding on the 28th day of June 1875 made in the matter of the said Parish of Kildorrery Ex parte The Reverend William Henry Clason of Rathcorumac in said County Clerk and the act First and Second Victoria Chapter 109 Section 32 on the application of the said Reverend William Henry Clason it was ascertained from the Dublin Gazette that the average price of oak for the period of seven years immediately preceding the date of said Order was fifteen shillings and one penny halfpenny for each barrel of fourteen stone.
