Act made in the fourth and fifth years of the Reign of King George  
the fourth to ascertain and fix a true and Just Composition  
for all Tythes arising growing yielded or payable within  
the Parish of Kildrum in the County of Kerry. Do Certify hereby  
~~that the true and Just amount of Composition for all Tythes~~  
whatever within the said Parish is One hundred and twenty  
pounds Sterling (Irish Currency) by the years. Two thirds of  
~~which~~ said sum of One hundred and twenty pounds Sterling  
Irish Currency is due and payable to the Right Honourable  
William Baron Lord Ventry as a Composition for the Tythes  
claimable by him as Lay Rector and the remaining one third  
of said sum of One hundred and twenty pounds Sterling Irish  
Currency is due and payable to the Reverend Robert Conway  
Hurly as a Composition for the Tythe claimable by him  
as Vicar of said Parish. And we do further Certify that  
the Average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown  
for the period of seven years ending the first day of November  
1821 was fifteen shillings and two pence per Barrell of  
Fourteen Stone - Dated this 16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1826 -
