

Two hundred and thirty pounds was due and payable by the year to George Walsh and August Everard the then Lay Impropriators of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish. And that the Rent Charge payable to the said Georgina Walsh and August T. Everard in lieu of said Composition was One hundred and seventy-two pounds ten shillings per annum being three-fourths of the said sum of Two hundred and thirty pounds. And it further appearing that the average price of Oats for the last Seven years was Eleven shillings and three pence halfpenny sterling per barrel and of Wheat Seventeen shillings and six pence per barrel according to the returns published in the Dublin Gazette. And upon hearing the evidence given before the said Justice in Open Court It is ordered by the said Justice that the said sum of Two hundred and thirty pounds being the Composition mentioned in said Certificate as payable to the Lay Impropriators be diminished by the sum of Eighty two pounds and that the same shall be One hundred and forty-eight pounds annually and that pursuant to the Statute of 1 and 2 Victoria cap. 109 the Rent Charge in lieu of said reduced Composition of One hundred and forty-eight pounds

shall be three fourths thereof that is to say a sum of One hundred and eleven pounds annually to be paid and payable to the parties entitled and that same shall commence and be payable from the first day of November 1896. And it is further ordered that the assessment and apportionment of the said Composition shall be amended accordingly and that the apportionment of the Rectorial Tithe Rent Charge in lieu of said Composition so payable to the said Georgina Walsh and August T. Everard be reduced and diminished in like proportion.
