and sworn to by virtue of an act made in the 4th year of
the reign of King George the 4th Chap. 94, entitled "an act
to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time" and under & by virtue of
another act passed in the fifth year of the reign of King
George 4th Chap. 63 entitled "an act to amend an act of the
last Session of Parliament for the providing for the establishing
of Compositions for tithes in Ireland," to ascertain & fix a true
and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or
payable within the Parish of Kilfenora, Diocese of Kilfenora, and
County of Clare, do hereby certify that the true & just amount
of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said
parish is two Hundred and fifty pounds Sterling British by
the year & that said sum of two Hundred & fifty pounds
Sterling British is due & payable to the very Rev. William
Henry Mackpool, Dean of Kilfenora as a Composition for
the tithes claimable by him as Rector & Vicar of the said
parish of Kilfenora, & we do further certify that the
said Composition do continue unvaried for the term of seven years
years, from the first day of November next, and we do further certify
that the ~~average~~ price of oats being the crop principally
grown in said County of Clare for the ~~last~~ seven years
ending on the first day of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings
two pence farthing the ^{per} Barrel. Dated this 13th day of
