

I, John J. Redington Commissioner, duly
appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the Fourth
year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "an act to provide
for the establishment of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
which act was afterwards amended by another Act, passed in the
Fifth year of the same Reign, and both which said Acts, were afterwards
amended by an act passed in the Seventh and Eighth years of the
same Reign, and which said three acts, were afterwards amended
by an act passed in the second and Third years of the Reign of his
present Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "an act to amend
three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the seventh and
Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the
Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland; and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and
fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded
or payable within the Parish of William, in the County of Meath; do
hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all
Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish, is Six hundred and Eighty
pounds by the year, of which sum of Six hundred and Eighty
pounds, one half part, amounting to the sum of one hundred and
Forty pounds, is due and payable to the Reverend Edwin Stock as
a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as the Vicar of the
said Parish, (to) one tenth part, amounting to the sum of Twenty
Eight pounds is due and payable to the Reverend John O'Keefe
as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as lessee of the
Impropriate Tithes of the said Parish, belonging to the Vicar
Choral of Christ Church and saint Patricks, Dublin, (to) Four
Eighth parts, amounting to the sum of one hundred and Twelve
Pounds, are due and payable to the Reverend Thomas Sutton
(Sutton)
