We the Rev Cecil Crampton of Cong. Ark and Isidore Wake  
of Limerick Esq<sup>r</sup> Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under  
and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of  
~~King George the Fourth Intituled An Act to provide for the~~  
Establishing of Compositors for Tithes in Ireland for a limited  
time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all  
Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of  
Kilmairbeg in the County of Mayo We hereby Certify that  
the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever  
within the said Parish is One Hundred and Thirty Seven Pounds  
fifteen Shillings and five pence by the Year. Of which Sum  
One Hundred and Twenty Seven Pounds fifteen Shillings and  
two pence halfpenny is due and payable to the Rev Francis  
Reedledge as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him  
as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish and the Sum of Ten Pounds  
and two pence halfpenny by the Year is due and payable to the  
Rev James Dunne as a Composition for the two thirds of the  
Tithes of the Townlands of Kiltrean claimable by him as  
Prebendary of Kiltrean. And We further Certify that  
the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown  
in such County for the period of Seven years ending on the  
first day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1821 is fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing  
per Barrel according to the Dublin Gazette average Sheet  
Given under Our Hands and Seals this 12<sup>th</sup> day of March 1827
