act made in the fourth year of the reign of
King George the Fourth to ascertain & fix a sum
& just amount of composition for all Tithe whatsover,
forming tithes, or payable within the Parish of
Silmalthead, in the united Diocese of Limerick
& Waterford & Glendalough in the County of Kerry -

Do hereby certify, that the sum & just amount
of composition for all Tithe whatsover within said
Parish is Eighty Three Pounds £. by the year, of
which sum of Eighty Three Pounds £. seven shillings
Pounds £. is due & payable to the Revd. Chas. P. P. P.
as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him
as Rector & Vicar of said Parish, & the remainder of
said sum of Eighty Three Pounds £. being Thirteen Pounds
£. six shillings, is due & payable to the Right Honble
William Lord Perceval as a composition for the Tithe claim-
able by him out of his proportion of said Parish, as
Lay Proprietor - And we do further certify that the
average price of oats being the most principally grown for
the price of seven years ending the first day of Novr. 1821, was
fifteen shillings & two pence farthing p. Bushel of Dublin
Winn - Dated this 18th Day of
October 1826 & Duly signed -
