We, the Commissioners, appointed to carry into effect, within the parochial Chapelry of Kilmacud, the provisions of the Act of the 4 Geo 4 Cap 99 - and for appollting the amount of Composition (being Forty Two pounds British Currency, equal to Forty Five pounds ten Shillings, late Currency) do find that said parochial Chapelry contains 280.0.22 Statute measure, that all the ground within the same is, as nearly as possible, of the same intrinsic Value, and that Three Shillings, is the proportionable charge for each Statute acre.
