

We, <sup>Mr</sup> Thomas Mahon <sup>and</sup> Charles Mahon Esqrs, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to provide for the establishing of Com-positions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time: to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Kiljiblane in the County of Clare, and Diocese of Killaloe do hereby certify, that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two Hundred and ninety Pounds Sterling by the year, of which Sum of Two Hundred and ninety Pounds Sterling, One Hundred and eighty pounds Sterling, are due and payable to Benjamin Scott Esq<sup>r</sup> as a composition for the Tithes claim- able by him as Lay Impropriator of the said Parish, and one Hundred and ten pounds Sterling are due and pay- able to the Rev<sup>d</sup> James Martin the Vicar of the said Parish.

And we do further certify, that the Average Price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the Period of Seven years, ending on the First day of November 1822 and Twenty one, is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing per Barrel. Dated and Given under our Hands this 31<sup>st</sup> Day of October 1823, and Twenty three.
