

W^o Thomas Weldon of Riverfield and Edmund
Wals of Mitchelstown Commissioners duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in
the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth,
intituled, an Act to provide for the establishment of
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for
all Tithes arising, growing yielded, or payable within
the Parish of Belfham in the County of Limerick, do
hereby certify that the true and just composition for
all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one
hundred and sixty pounds Sterling by the year -
Which sum of one hundred and sixty pounds has
been unanimously agreed upon on the ^{part} of the Owners
and occupiers of land within said Parish at a
special meeting held in the Parish Church on the
22nd day of July 1828 to be invariably paid for
21 years to the Rev^d Arch^d Neville as a composition
for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of the Parish
of Belfham and which composition has been approved
on the part of the Bishop of the Diocese -
