Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth intituled "an act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix annual and Just Compositions for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Keshlin in the County of Kerry. do hereby Certify that the Just and true amount of Compositions for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Ninety two Pounds by the year of which Sum of Ninety two Pounds, one half is due and payable to the Earl of Cork as owner of the rectorial Tithes and one half is due and payable to the Rev. Edwin Thomas the vicar of said Parish.

And we further Certify that the average price of Oats, being the Oats principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings per Barrel.
