I Charles Omalley of Cloouane COMMISSIONER duly appointed and sworn, under, and by virtue of an Act of Second and Third William the Fourth, intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition of Tithes in Ireland; and to make such Composition permanent, and to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Helface in the Diocesso of Achony in the County of Higo do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever, within said Parish is Two Hundred and tighty Seven fromes luck Eight pence by the Year, of which Sum of Two Hundred and lighty June from a lux light pence one half is due and payable to the light Honough Sond biscount Lonton for Composition claimed by him as Lay Impropriator of the Tithes, and one half is due and payable to The Award Same Elwood \_ as Vicar of the said Parish, and I do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of Seven Years, ending on the First day of November, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, is Further Shilling, and Sterling per Ban Sterling per Barrel.
