

I, John Henderson Commissioner, duly appointed
 and sworn (under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second
 and Third years, of the Reign of King William the Fourth) entitled
 an Act to amend three Acts, passed respectively in the Fourth
 Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his
 late Majesty, King George the Fourth, providing for the es-
 tablishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland; and to
 make such compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix
 a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing
 yielded, or payable within the Parish of Killgarvin
 Diocese of Killaloe, in the County of Mayo. Do certify
 that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes
 whatsoever within the said Parish is Two Hundred and
Eighty one Pounds Seventeen Shillings and Nine Pence
Halfpenny, by the year of which sum of £281.17s.9d. one
 Hundred and Forty Pounds Eighteen Shillings and Ten
 Pence Halfpenny is due and Payable to the Rev^d Joseph
 Verschoyke Vicar of said Parish as a composition for the
 Tithes claimed by him as owner of the Vicarial Tithes
 And one Hundred and Forty Pounds Eighteen Shillings and
 Ten Pence Halfpenny is due and Payable to Walter Bourke Esq^r
 Heir of the late Rodger Palmer Esq^r as a composition
 claimed by him as owner of the Rectorial Tithes of the said Parish

 for the Period of Seven years ending on the First day of
 November 1830 Thirty six Shillings and Eleven
 Pence Halfpenny per Borel as taken from the Dublin Gazette
