true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing yield-  
ed or payable within the Parish of Kilkary in the County of  
Tipperary and diocess of Killaloe, do hereby certify, that the true  
and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the  
said parish, is one hundred and thirty pounds ~~ster~~ by the  
Year, which Sum is due and payable to the very Rev.<sup>d</sup>  
John Bayly master of arts, Dean of Killaloe, rector and vicar  
of such parish, for the space time and term of twenty one  
years from the date hereof - and we do further certify  
that the average price of wheat being the corn principally  
grown in such parish for the period of seven years ending  
on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1825 is £ 1. 10. 0<sup>th</sup> the Barrel -  
Given under our hands this 20<sup>th</sup> Day of April, 1825
