The Rector, Blood & Thistle, Southampton Common duly appointed & sworn under the virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intituled an act to provide for the establishment of compensation for tithes in England for a limited time to ascertain & fix a true & just compensation for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of St. Nicholas in the City of London do hereby certify that the true & just amount of compensation for all tithes whatsover within said Parish is One hundred & fifty six pounds four shillings & four pence half penny of which sum of One hundred & fifty six pounds four shillings & four pence half penny One hundred & thirty one pound one shilling & three pence half penny are due & payable to the Rector Blood as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish & Twenty pounds eleven shillings & four pence half penny are due & payable to the Rev. John Thomas Fitzgerald as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Impropriator of Mayree & Ten pounds eleven shillings eight pence half penny are due & payable to the Rev. J. W. Wood as Vicar of the Parish of Tomgray. And we do further certify that the average price of Oats being the corn principally grown in such parish for the period of seven years ending on the first day of Nov 1821 is £0.15.2½ Dated this 2 Day of Nov 1824
