George the fourth intituled "an act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time and an act to amend the same" to ascertain and fix a True and Just Composi-  
tion for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the parish of Killane in the County  
of Wick. as hereby verily was the True and Just amount of Composition for all Tithes  
whatsoever within the said parish is Ninety Eight pounds Thirteen Shillings and four  
pence by the year. of which Sum of Ninety Eight pounds Thirteen Shillings and four  
pence Seventy four pounds the three fourth parts are due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
Ralph Dillon <sup>his successors</sup> as Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector of the said  
parish and Twenty four pounds Thirteen Shillings and four pence are fourth part  
is due and payable to the Bishop of the Diocese of Clonfert <sup>his successors</sup>

And we do further certify that the average price of Oats being the ~~the~~ principally grown in  
such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November One  
Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty One is Ten Shillings and Ten Shillings per Barrel  
Dated this 22<sup>d</sup> day of October 1823 free
