

We Francis Stealy and George Thomas Commissioners
 duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act
 made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the
 Fourth to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
 for all the Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the
 parish of Millaken in the County of Kerry. Do Certify
 that the true and just amount of Composition for all
 Tithes whatsoever within said parish is One hundred and
 Thirty six pounds ten shillings, being by the Year
 out of which sum of one hundred and Thirty six pounds
 Ten Shillings, Forty five pounds ten Shillings are
 due and payable to the Reverend Edwin Thomas as Vicar
 of said parish and the remaining Ninety one pounds is due
 and payable to Lord Cork or to those deriving as
 Lessees under him as a Composition for the Tithes claimed
 by them of said parish —

And we do further Certify that the
 average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such
 County for the period of Seven Years ending the first of
 November 1821 was fifteen Shillings and two pence per
 Bushell of fourteen Stone — Date 31st March 1824
