We the Reverend Cathbert Fetherston H and William Welsh duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth. Intituled An Act to provide for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, Yielded and payable within the Parish of Killaloe and County of Clare. Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is £ 400 Sterling by the year of which sum £ 80 Sterling by the year is due and payable to the Lord Bishop of Killaloe or those lawfully deriving under him from time to time as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as owner of the Mousal Tithes of said Parish heretofore arising out of certain Plow lands and Eel Fisheries in said Parish —

That the sum of £ 320 Sterling by the year is due and payable to the Dean and Chapter of Killaloe for the time being owners of the Economy Tithe of said Parish of Killaloe —

And we do further Certify that the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in — said County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1821 is fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing by the Dublin Gazette
