

fifteen shillings, per acre shall pay the sum
of one shilling and one half penny per acre and
so in proportion for woods and parks, as a
composition for all the tithes thereof. We find that
Sixty two acres, one Rood and twenty seven perches,
value ten shillings, per acre shall pay the sum
of eight pence further per acre and so in proportion
for woods and parks, as a composition for
all the tithes thereof. We find that two
hundred and forty one acres, two Roods and
fifteen perches, value five shillings, per
acre shall pay the sum of four pence
per acre and so in proportion for woods,
and parks, as a composition for all the
tithes thereof. We find that Six hundred
and twenty five acres, three Roods, and
eight perches, value two shillings, per acre
shall pay the sum of three half pence per
acre and so in proportion for all the
tithes thereof.

We find that two
hundred and forty seven acres, and
one Rood one of us value for tithage
or pasture, and finally we find that
the abovementioned sums, payable out
of the abovementioned quantities, of land
make the sum of two hundred and
seventy pounds the sum
agreed on as a composition for all the
tithes of said Parish. Given under our
