

J Patrick Smith a Commissioner duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign of his present Majesty, King William the Fourth, entitled "an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition, for all the Improperiate Tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Millarney, in the Diocese of Meath and the County of Kerry.

I do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all the Improperiate Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Two hundred and thirty five pounds Sterling, by the Year, (and is due and Payable to the Right Honorable Lord Donoughmore as Lay Proprietor, or to James P Lavelor of Millarney in the County of Kerry Esq, as his Possee thereof ... And I further Certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said Parish, for the period of Seven years ending on the first day of November, One thousand Eight hundred and thirty is twelve Shillings and eleven pence half penny Sterling per Barrel.
