(having been duly appointed and sworn a Commissioner under, and by virtue of, an Act made in the Second and Third years of the Reign of King WILLIAM IV. intituled—"An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King GEO. IV., providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent"—to Ascertain and Fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killashen in the Diocese of Ardagh in the County of Longford ) DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the True and Just amount of Composition for all Tithes, whatever, within the said

Parish of Killashen as Ascertained from the Seven Years Average preceding the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty, is One Hundred and Eighty Pounds Seven Shillings & Eight pence Sterling by the Year, of which Sum of One Hundred and Eighty Three pounds Seven Shillings and Eight pence, the sum of One Hundred and Forty Eight pounds Nine Shillings and ten pence

is due and payable  
as a Composition for all  
Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar  
Since the sum of Thirty Four pounds Seventeen Shillings and  
Ten pence Sterling

is due and payable to his Grace the Arch Bishop of  
of Ireland as Bishop of  
from and out of the Townlands of Brinacly, Ballinakile,  
Ballinamona, Clogagh, Clonbrock, Clonvara, Clonkeel,  
Derrigogue, Killeeney, Middlestown, and Rapparee Hill, out  
of which Townlands his Grace is Entitled to two thirds  
of the Litter of Crops Only.

And I do further Certify, that the average price of Oats—being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven Years, ending the First Day of November, One thousand eight hundred and thirty—is Twelve Shillings and Thirteen pence  
Given under my hand this <sup>First</sup> day of October  
in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
