of Ardagh, this 9<sup>th</sup> of November 1859

I James West O'Brien (having been duly appointed  
and sworn a Commissioner under and by virtue, of an Act  
made in the second and third years of the Reign of King  
William IV: intituled - "An Act to amend three  
acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the  
seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty  
King Geo: IV: providing for the establishing of Composi-  
tions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions  
permanent" - to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielding,  
or payable within the parish of Killashie in the  
Diocese of Ardagh in the County of Longford) -  
Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said  
parish of Killashie as ascertained from the seven  
years average preceding the first day of November  
one thousand eight hundred and thirty, is one  
hundred and eighty three pounds seven shillings  
and eight pence sterling by the year, of which sum  
of one hundred and eighty three pounds seven  
shillings and eight pence, the sum of one  
hundred and forty eight pounds nine shillings  
and ten pence is due and payable to the Reverend  
William Digby as a Composition for all Tithes  
claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of said parish.  
And the sum of thirty four pounds seventeen
