

W^e Arthur Irwin and Robert Dickson duly
sworn and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made
the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intituled
"An Act for the Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland
for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just
composition for all tithes arising from ground payable
within the parish of Skillypatrik being a member of the
Parish of Saint John Sligo in the County of Sligo
Do Certify that the true and just amount of composition
for all tithes whatsoever within the said parish is two
hundred pounds ten shillings & three pence by the year
of which sum of two hundred pounds ten shillings and
three pence the whole and entire amount is due & payable
to the Rev^d Charles Hamilton as a composition for
the tithes claimable by him as Rector and Rector of the
said Parish. And W^e do further Certify that the
average price of oats being the corn principally sown
in such lands for the period of seven years ending
on the first day of November one thousand eight
hundred and twenty one is fifteen shillings and two
pence farthing per barrel. Given under our hands
at Sligo this 29th day of April 1824
