the establishing a Composition for Tythes in Ireland
for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true
and just Composition for all Tythes arising growing
yielding or payable within the Parish of Killea in
the County of Donegal Do hereby Certify that
the true and just Amount of Composition for all
Tythes whatsoever within the said Parish is One
Hundred and Seventy Pounds Sterly by the Year
the Mensal or Glebe Lands Comprehended within the
Townland of Ashgrove or Maghnaaboooy & Coniguous to the
Glebe House being expressly by agreement made by the
Parishioners & Incumbent excepted & exempted from paying
any Part or portion of such Composition and We do
further Certify that the average price of Oats (which
is the grain chiefly grown or cultivated within the
said Parish of Killea) has been Fifteen Shillings and
two pence ^{the legal} farthing for the last seven years as appears from
the Dublin Gazette - for the period of seven years
ending the first of November 1821 - ^{from Mr. D. O'Connell}
this 27th day of Oct. 1830
